Expanding riverfront facilities, tourism and businesses was the focus of the planning processes held for six local communities.





Vision

The Quad Cities community will realize that poverty for some impacts us all. Building on the stable foundations provided by our local public housing authorities, other resources, services, and advocates, we will innovate sustainable community systems – systems that encourage and support families to reach their self–sufficiency goals. A crucial outcome of this work is that parents will be in better position to positively influence their children's life opportunities, thereby interrupting the long–term generational cycle of poverty.


Strategy #1 and 2

- Engage the Quad Cities housing authorities in leading this initiative to interrupt the cycle of poverty.
- Begin this journey to interrupt generational poverty by partnering with the section 8 voucher choice program and public housing participants who have taken productive steps to self-sufficiency.

Strategy #3

Invest in the ongoing collaborative leadership needed to support inclusive partnerships that include, even rely upon the people being served as experts of their life situations.


