- Illinois workNet is the state's web portal system for workforce development
- Illinois workNet® is a portal to connect individuals, employers, and education, workforce and community partners to career planning, education and training, and employment resources and tools. The portal connects people to local and statewide in-person and online services. The system includes Workforce Innovation Opportunity Act (WIOA) resources, services and tools.
- Illinois workNet continues to build out tools and resources that align with the state's workforce and education needs.
