



Partners in Education

CHA public housing residents and Housing Choice Voucher participants can obtain a degree or certificate from City Colleges of Chicago at low or no cost.

- Last dollar support to attend City Colleges of Chicago
- Serves primarily non-traditional, returning college students
- Average age of participant is 32 years old
- Many are not financial aid eligible due to previous unsuccessful enrollment
- Eligible expenses include tuition, uniforms, books, and exam fees.
- Residents must attend a mandatory information session webinar to learn about CCC and PIE enrollment processes.
- Information Sessions are implemented by CCC Program Coordinators

Fresh Start Initiative New! CCC Debt Forgiveness Program

- Debt forgiveness program
- Students who attended City Colleges of Chicago in the last ten years and are in good standing
- Have debt that prevents them from completing their degree or certificate.



CHA/S2S Scholarship


A scholarship offered in partnership with our non-profit entity, Springboard to Success.

- Over 125 scholarships awarded annually
- High school seniors, undergraduate students or adults seeking to start a post-secondary program
- Awards increased to \$2,000
- Can be used at an accredited, 4-year institution of student's choice
- Scholarship application period open from January to May



LevelUp (formerly Family Self-Sufficiency)

Goal focused program to assist participants to increase financial stability and move forward on an individualized path toward economic independence and well-being.



LevelUp

Each participant comes into the program with a unique set of personal goals, some of which include:

- Reducing debt/improving credit
- Earning a post-secondary degree
- Starting a new career
- Starting a business
- Becoming a homeowner

- Increased cross-program awareness and engagement across the agency




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
