


NATIONAL AND STATE LEVEL DATA



National College Attainment Network (NCAN) FAFSA Tracker-Illinois

Through **July 5, 2024**, **46.6**% of the **high school class of 2024** has completed a FAFSA. There have been **1,940,452** completions nationally, a **-11.2**% change compared to last academic year.





National FAFSA Tracker - Illinois


- We rank in 5th
 place nationally as
 of July 5, 2024
- The National College Attainment Network (NCAN) reports on FAFSAs completed, not FAFSAs submitted
- We are above the national average by 9.3%

 ISAC completion data includes all Illinois Public High School senior students who have filed a FAFSA or Alternative Application


Financial Aid Application Completion Rates for 2023 and 2024






Monetary Award Program (MAP) Recipients

A majority of MAP recipients attend a public university or a public community college




More than half of MAP recipients have no resources for college.

Characteristics of Paid Dependent/Independent Combined MAP Recipients FY2023




54 percent have a federal Expected Family Contribution (the amount they can be expected to pay toward college) of zero.


CLASS OF 2024 COMPLETION DATA

The Financial Aid Application Completion Initiative

- Identify students who have completed a financial aid application or non-participation form
- Identify students who have not completed a financial aid application or non-participation form
- Identify if a student needs assistance with their financial aid application – e.g., if they filed a FAFSA but no SAI was generated





Financial Aid Application Data Matching

ISBE provides ISAC with public school's class rosters;
Private schools must upload their own roster

Your student roster is then matched with FAFSAs and Alternative Applications that are filed each day

ISAC updates a school's completion data every day

ISAC updates the Performance Metrics page every Monday



New Functions in GAP Access

- The non-participation form is now completed via ISAC's student portal
- Once a student completes the form, it will automatically populate in GAP Access
- Paper Waiver Tracking





New Functions in GAP Access (continued)


- You can now complete the Good Faith Effort Form via GAP Access
- This can be used for students who do not want to file a financial aid application or waiver and for students who have extenuating circumstances

New Functions in GAP Access (continued)

 Anyone with an admin account can now grant an admin waiver with FAFSA Simplification as the rationale






New Functions in GAP Access (continued)

- You can now see Unmatched Opt-Out Forms
- Students who complete the waiver online and enter your high school, but the information they reported does not match on GAP Access

What can you do with the information from the report?

- For students who have a FAFSA Filed, but have no SAI:
 - This indicates a correction needs to be made; therefore, reach out to these students to help them during the school day
- For students who have not filed an application or waiver:
 - Having a conversation about their postsecondary options
 - Do students know what a FAFSA is?
 - Are they interested in pursuing a postsecondary credential but are unsure of how to get started?
 - Send a reminder message about completing an application or waiver and where to find support



What can you do with the information from the report? (continued)

- For a student who has a confirmation email, but they show as no FAFSA filed in GAP Access:
 - Data match issue check spelling of name, check the student completed the correct application year
- Share the information with additional counselors and staff
- How often are you checking GAP Access?
 - Are you checking once a day, once a week?





Recognition of Excellence Awards


- Recognition of efforts from high schools that focus on supporting their students and families through the financial aid process
- Recognition is awarded based on the school's financial aid application completion rates
- Completion rates are calculated based on the high school's class roster that were provided in one of two ways:
 - ISBE-provided data (public high schools)
 - Class roster upload (Private schools)





Recognition of Excellence: Performance Metrics

- Schools are designated one of the following recognitions:
 - Platinum ≥ 95%
 - Gold ≥ 85%
 - Silver ≥ 75%
 - Bronze ≥ 65%

Plus, ISAC offers **one-on-one virtual meetings** to assist you in completing the application quickly and easily. Generally, we can help you complete the FAFSA in 30 minutes or less if you gather the info you need beforehand.

*Please note that most students will complete the FAFSA to determine their eligibility for federal and state financial aid. The Alternative Application for Illinois Financial Aid is the application for eligible undocumented students to apply for state financial aid.
